Who Should Invest?

The Pointbreak Money Market Fund is suitable for investors seeking a low risk investment that maximises income. It offers a high income yield, capital stability and good liquidity.

Investment Objective

The fund's objective is to achieve an investment return in excess of general money market instruments and funds, while ensuring a high degree of liquidity, capital preservation and below average risk. The fund invests with the four major banking groups in Namibia, the five major banking groups in South Africa, Nampost Namibia and the Namibian, and South African Reserve Bank. Securities to be included in the portfolio consist of money market instruments, participatory interests in unit trust schemes, bank call and fixed deposits, fixed income securities, government bills and bonds, quality commercial paper and repurchase agreements.

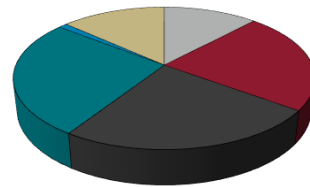
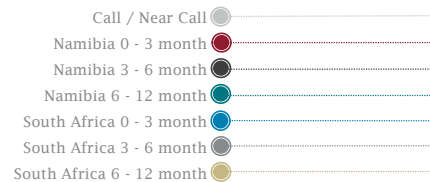
Fund Commentary

Global and local inflation is gradually easing but expected to remain elevated over the medium- to long-term, thus placing pressure on policy makers to remain hawkish. Namibia inflation for April surprised to the downside, coming in at 6.1% year-on-year (y/y) which was lower compared to the March print of 7.2% y/y. This was the lowest annual CPI released since the June 2022 print of 6.0% y/y. South Africa's inflation remains stubborn as the economy continues with challenges like higher cost of doing business in SA and the depreciation of the currency.

The Bank of Namibia increased the repo rate by 25bps to 7.25%, lagging the SA repo rate by 50bps. Given the interest rate differential, all the Namibian T-Bills traded below their SA counterparts. April saw the 12-month SA T-Bill breaching the 9.0% level, 102bps higher than the Namibian counterpart.

Given the fund's current SA exposure, the fund will continue to take advantage of any higher yielding opportunities in the market.
